DEDICATION: BRIAN SEAGRAVES

The Georgia Pharmacist Magazine honors a beloved College of Pharmacy faculty member who has committed himself to his students and colleagues. It is evident to anyone who interacts with him that he has a tangible passion for the field of pharmacy and maintains genuine care for his students and patients. UGA's CoP is excited and proud to dedicate this year's Georgia Pharmacist Magazine to Dr. Brian Seagraves. This is the third year he has received this coveted designation, which is determined by the graduating PharmD class at the College.

As a 2004 graduate of UGA's College of Pharmacy, Dr. Seagraves has committed almost two decades to serving others as a Clinical Pharmacist. After receiving his Doctor of Pharmacy degree, he began working in a private pharmaceutical practice. Then, in 2016, Dr. Seagraves returned to his alma mater to teach the next generations of pharmacists.

Dr. Seagraves can detect the abilities and potential in his students, and he strives to make them realize their own capabilities. One of his students detailed how "...his door is always open to his students – starting from day one. He is always there to listen and provide support in any way he can." Another student observed how "...he has unwavering belief in students, even when they question themselves. He has always encouraged me to be a well-rounded pharmacist, because that's how you can be most effective in terms of working as a team, taking care of your patient, and taking care of yourself."

Dr. Seagraves's commitment goes well beyond his work with the CoP. He has served as the director of the Mercy Health Center's Hep-C Clinic, a free hepatitis C treatment location, for more than 14 years. He is the current Chair of the Athens Nurses Clinic, which offers another free hepatitis C treatment site. In addition, he is on the board for Women to the World. Dr. Seagraves explains, "I have a strong love for people and a strong desire to serve my community. I wholeheartedly believe that civic involvement is what will make our community robust and prosperous."

Former Associate Dean Dr. George Francisco, a previous recipient of this honor, notes that "Dr. Seagraves is truly dedicated to the profession of pharmacy as demonstrated by his long hours and tireless efforts at the College, the considerable amount of time he serves at community health care practices, and his daily interactions with other pharmacists."

Instead of focusing on the difficulty of situations that he is confronted with, Dr. Seagraves embraces the opportunity to have an impact in all he does. "It is such an honor to receive this award again. It is extremely reassuring to know that I am actually making a positive impact on my students, colleagues, and surrounding community."

Along with receiving this honor twice before – in 2018 and 2020 – Dr. Seagraves was previously awarded: 2010 – 2011 UGA College of Pharmacy APPE Preceptor of the Year (2010); Mercy Health Center Volunteer of the Year (2011); 2015 Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine College of Pharmacy APPE Preceptor of the Year (2014); Joseph D. Greene Community Service Award (2016); UGA CoP Teacher of the Year (2020); UGA CoP Teacher of the Year Nominee (2018); Georgia Society of Health-System Pharmacists (GSHP) Community Service Award (2019).

COMMENCEMENT REMARKS FROM CLASS PRESIDENT NICK ROZELLE

So when we walk from this place, we walk transformed. By this moment, by the journey we've taken, together, by what we've experienced and all we've learned. We will carry this golden memory with us and all the golden memories made along the way.

So that we can draw upon them the next time we face challenge, or when a friend gets the news no one wants to hear, or when we find love and family, or in the day to day walk to work, lunch with a friend, on the bus or in the pharmacy, with a patient or a friend.

AMERICAN PHARMACISTS ASSOCIATION- ACADEMY OF STUDENT PHARMACISTS

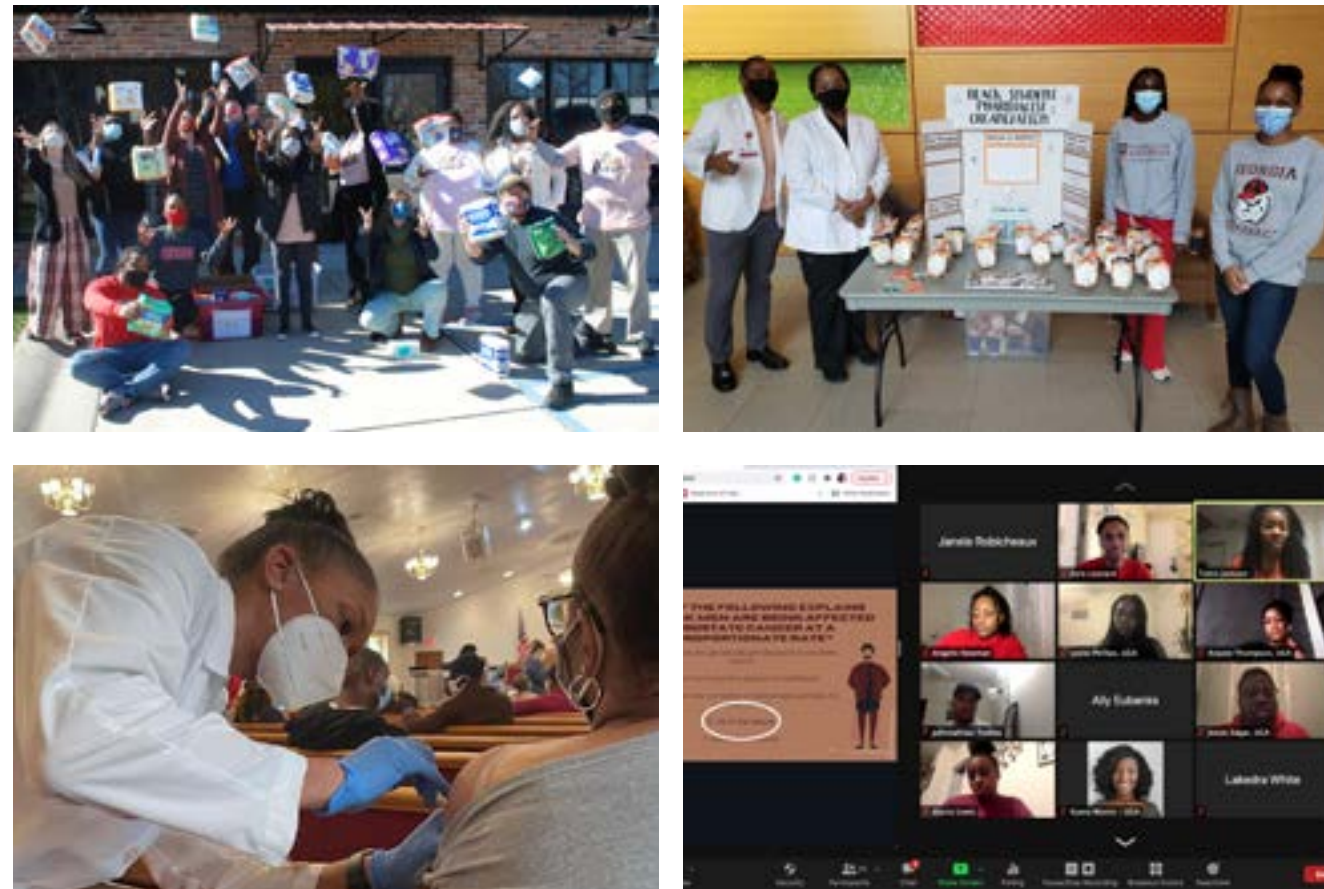


The American Pharmacists Association-Academy of Student Pharmacists (APhA-ASP) is proud to be the largest student organization at the University of Georgia College of Pharmacy. The APhA-ASP mission is to be the “collective voice of student pharmacists, to provide opportunities for professional growth, and to envision and actively promote the future of pharmacy.” At the College of Pharmacy, APhA-ASP plays a key role in helping students navigate through pharmacy school, advocate policy related to pharmacy practice, explore careers in pharmacy, and connect with student pharmacists and professional pharmacists nationwide. Members are able to network locally with the Georgia Pharmacy Association as well as nationally with the American Pharmacists Association. Our members experience a variety of benefits, including professional development resources, career guidance, networking opportunities, leadership development, and study resources for national board exams. Our APhA-ASP chapter organizes several health fairs and patient care events throughout the year and sends members to local, state, and national conferences.

This year, despite the COVID circumstances, UGA APhA-ASP hosted over 50 events and presentations! We used this year as an opportunity to develop

new, creative events to give students the ability to participate in giving back to the community. We introduced events such as our Women’s Health Signature Drive and IPSF Spooky Mask Competition. This was the first year that we had our Women’s Health Initiative, and we are so excited to continue educating our classmates and community on this important topic! Last but not least, we hosted our annual health fair, Pharmtoberfest, with a twist: patient education was available online for a whole week! Typically, this event is held for one day with point of care testing, a flu vaccine clinic, and educational presentations depicted on tri-fold boards. This year, with the help of other pharmacy organizations and all of our Operations, we published a variety of educational video presentations, flyers, and games with the theme “What can your pharmacist do for you?” Our landing page on the College of Pharmacy website received over 600 views, making this year one for the books! We still held an in-person portion and provided flu vaccines, blood glucose testing, and blood pressure readings. Speaking of point of care testing, we also hosted point of care events for the community in the fall and spring at a local pharmacy, Hawthorne Drugs. We can’t wait to be back in person and build off of what we started and continued to do this year!

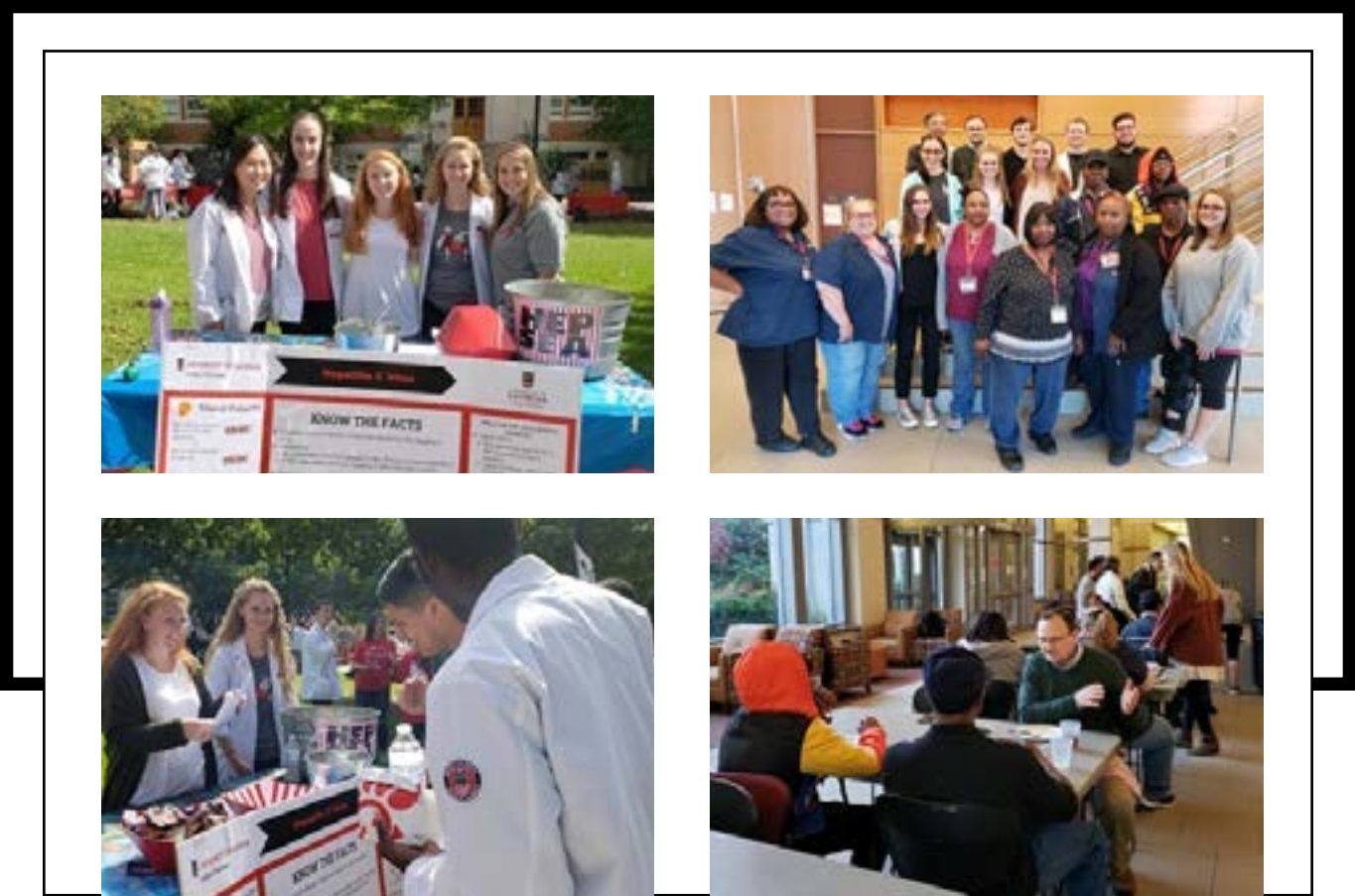
BLACK STUDENT PHARMACIST ORGANIZATION



Black Student Pharmacist Organization (BSPO) is a collective dedicated to effectively recruiting, serving, and retaining underrepresented minority students studying pharmacy by enhancing their academic experience through informational, academic, social, and community support. Membership is open to all enrolled students or faculty members regardless of race, color, creed, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, national origin, or academic classification who are willing to commit to the vision and purpose of BSPO. One aspect of our vision is to create an environment that acknowledges and celebrates diversity and employs inclusive practices throughout its daily operations. We achieve this in our Minority Leadership Series which highlights positive Black representation in the College of Pharmacy (COP). BSPO educates the COP and community at large about issues specific to African-American/Black students while encouraging cultural sensitivity. Such education takes place during original programming events such as “MythBusters!” and in our quarterly publication The Mortar & Pestle. This organization also strives to provide a wide variety of resources, such as toiletry drives for local non-profit organizations and vaccine clinics in efforts to give back to predominantly African-American/Black communities. Our main objective, however, is to provide personal, social support for minority students who might not receive such outlets in larger organizations. COLLEGE OF PSYCHIATRIC NEUROLOGIC PHARMACISTS



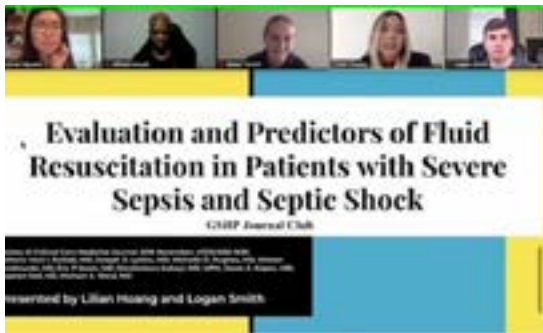
Christian Pharmacists Fellowship International (CPFI) is an interdenominational ministry of pharmacists and pharmacy students whose mission is to serve Christ and the world through pharmacy. The UGA chapter of CPFI provides opportunities for service within our college and the Athens community and promotes the spiritual growth of our members. This fall, we continued our annual partnership with Athens PBJs by preparing and distributing 70 sack lunches to the homeless population of downtown Athens. We also hosted ten Zoom Bible studies throughout the year to cultivate personal spiritual growth and fellowship among our members. Additionally, CPFI supported college-wide initiatives by educating the community about heartburn during Pharmtoberfest Week and by hosting a virtual pharmacy trivia night for the UGA Miracle Fundraising Competition.



The College of Psychiatric and Neurologic Pharmacists is dedicated to shedding light on the issues facing psychiatric and neurologic pharmacy. CPNP's main goal is to spread awareness to the students and community. CPNP members organize events such as guest speakers in the field, posting social media blasts for awareness, participating in philanthropy walks, and participating in NAMI's mental illness awareness week. CPNP members also believe that fundraising for national nonprofit organizations that advocate for psychological and neurologic disorders can have a huge impact on awareness and improving the lives of those living with these conditions. Therefore, members have participated in fundraising for the National Alliance on Mental Illness, Down Syndrome Association, Autism Association, National Eating Disorder Association, and more. CPNP also advocates for a stigma free environment in our school and profession.

Since the rate of mental disorders is increasing in the American population, CPNP also feels it important to create a support system for its members, the college of pharmacy, and the community. As a unique feature of the UGA chapter, we organize mental health breaks for our members and friends. These events include movie nights, attending sporting events, yoga in the park, kayaking, and more! These events allow us to take a break from our stressful lives and bond with each other. We have created an environment of encouragement which benefits our own mental health while advocating for mental health among our profession and extending into others.

GEORGIA SOCIETY OF HEALTH-SYSTEM PHARMACISTS



The Georgia Society of Health-System Pharmacists is an officially recognized student society of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists, which aims to provide pharmacy students with opportunities to gain further insight into health-system pharmacy through networking events, patient advocacy, and volunteer opportunities. During the Fall, we hold a Residency Roundtable networking event featuring program directors and residents throughout Georgia. This event affords students the chance to learn more about residencies from experts to explore how a residency will aid in their career development. GSHP also hosts monthly journal clubs, allowing students to review relevant journal articles and present their findings to the organization. This year, we partnered with the Athens-Clarke County Government to deliver health-related presentations to ACCG members. These

opportunities help students develop their presentation skills and prepare them for clinical seminar, rotations, residency, and their eventual pharmacy practice. In the Spring, GSHP hosts the Practice Advancement Initiative (PAI) Week. This is a week full of events aimed at helping student pharmacists better understand the profession and recognize ways to enhance our practice as pharmacists on the healthcare team. The mission of our organization is to serve as the collective voice of pharmacy students at the University of Georgia interested in health-system pharmacy, to provide resources and opportunities for professional growth and to actively promote the future of health-system pharmacy. We believe that these events provide an outlet to inform students about the benefits of careers in health-system pharmacy and prepare them for future roles as institutional practitioners.

INDUSTRY PHARMACISTS ORGANIZATION



IPhO is exclusively dedicated to advancing the careers of industry pharmacists by 1. providing timely and relevant information that is vital to our members, 2. Raising awareness among employers and industry executives about the role that industry pharmacists can play in drug development and appropriate medication use, 3. Providing targeted resources and coaching to enhance members' continuing education and professional development 4. Creating opportunities for members to network and exchange ideas with their industry pharmacist peers 5. Providing access to attractive and relevant employment opportunities available in industry. We provide introductions to field of industry to pharmacy students as well as other professional

development opportunities. This past year, our chapter held Annual Round Table Collaboration with AMCP. Nineteen professionals attended this virtual event to speak with 24 students about industry and managed care pharmacy. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the event took place over Zoom, where attendees were placed in 15-minute rounds of breakout rooms and interacted in a "speed dating" format. Each room had 2-3 students and 2-3 representatives, and there were six rounds in total. There was a great amount of interest, especially from P2s and P3s. It was a unique opportunity for them to network and ask questions about managed care and industry pharmacy. Representatives were impressed with the students' active engagement and their goals.

KAPPA PSI



Kappa Psi is the world's largest and oldest pharmacy fraternity. Founded in 1879, Kappa Psi is composed of 155 active chapters throughout the United States, Canada, and the Bahamas. Since the fraternity's beginnings, the brothers of Kappa Psi have aimed to support and advance the profession of pharmacy through innovation and fellowship. The Gamma Phi chapter here at the University of Georgia was chartered in 1951. The fraternity seeks the opportunity to teach its brothers the skills they need to learn to be good leaders, resources, and professionals in our communities. Today, Kappa Psi at the University of Georgia continues to thrive as an active and involved group, working within the fraternity as well as outside organizations to achieve common goals.

While we are not the largest student organization at the college, we try our best to apply ourselves to the old adage that quality is more important than quantity. The faculty and collegiate brothers of Gamma Phi regularly volunteer and participate in several events throughout the year. We annually assist the College of Pharmacy with the white coat ceremony, orientation, open house, family day, homecoming, and applicant interviews. Our long-term projects include raising money for a Gamma Phi endowment, continuing improvements to our fraternity house, hosting alumni events for graduate brothers, and securing an academic scholarship for a deserving Gamma Phi brother.

LAMBDA KAPPA SIGMA



Lambda Kappa Sigma is a professional fraternity for pharmacy women. The Alpha Kappa Chapter was established in 1958 at the University of Georgia, where it provides professional and social guidance. The objectives of LKS include: (a) providing a place for fellowship for women away from the scholastic atmosphere, (b) offering a personal approach to the adjustment to the field of pharmacy and campus life at UGA, (c) providing encouragement for academic accomplishments, (d) being of service to the community as a vital health practitioner and (e) expanding opportunities for professional advances beyond the college years.

Here at UGA, the Alpha Kappa Chapter invites all pharmacy women to recruit in the fall semester. In addition to better acquainting members with fellow students, this activity helps new students learn more about the

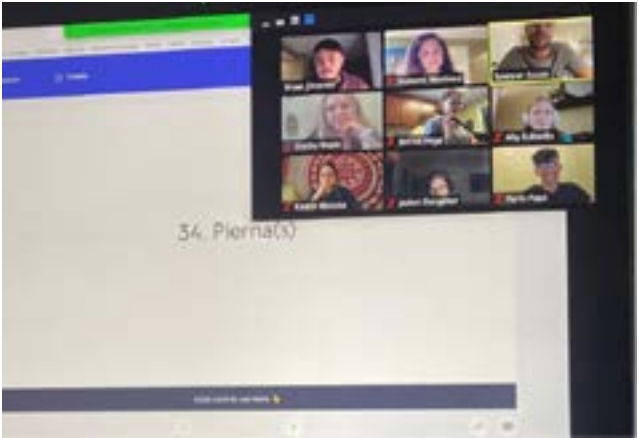
fraternity and become familiar with pharmacy school itself. Invitations to join are offered at the completion of recruitment events. As a professional pharmacy organization, LKS actively participates in service projects, including sponsorship of an "In Their Shoes" team, which benefits the Loran Smith Center at ARMC, hosting a Girl Scouts' Day to help them earn their first aid badge, and volunteering at the local food bank and Athens Area Homeless Shelter. Social activities include recruitment events, summer retreat, Apothecary Ball, and many more. For many pharmacy women, membership in LKS provides a break from pressures of classwork by establishing a place for fellowship. The Alpha Kappa Chapter of LKS has become a significant voice among many pharmacy women at the University of Georgia.

NATIONAL COMMUNITY PHARMACISTS ASSOCIATION

NATIONAL HISPANIC PHARMACISTS ASSOCIATION



The NCPA student chapter of UGA is the representative group for the National Community Pharmacists Association. NCPA is a national organization which represents the interests of Independent Pharmacy. The goal of our student chapter is to educate the student members on the opportunities that entrepreneurship provides and enable them through networking and other activities to take advantage of the opportunities available. Membership is open to any student in the College of Pharmacy. NCPA membership allows students the opportunity to apply for scholarships and compete in national NCPA competitions. Guests from many areas of community pharmacy are invited to speak at chapter meetings to inform our members of the many aspects of community pharmacy. Our UGA Chapter currently provides educational events with health screenings at local pharmacies. The pocket reference Clinical Pearls: A Pharmacotherapy Guide for Student Practice Experiences, is updated annually by our members. NCPA is truly the voice of the community pharmacist.



The National Hispanic Pharmacists Association’s mission is focused around improving cultural competence in the pharmacy arena in order to foster better health outcomes for Hispanic patients. Not all members of NHPA speak Spanish, but many are interested in learning the language and better serving their Latinx patients. This year, our general body meetings consisted of learning common Spanish phrases and terms relating to some of the more common disease states, followed by a Kahoot! game at the end of each meeting.

This year, despite being in the midst of a pandemic, our organization strived to continue our community outreach efforts. Our members collaborated to gather crucial information regarding COVID-19 vaccines. Informative pamphlets were created in both English and Spanish, and distributed throughout the community. Tools like these are effective in educating patient populations about vaccine safety and efficacy in order to improve trust and increase vaccination rates.

We look forward to another great year where we can expand our outreach efforts and continue to engage with our community members.

PHI DELTA CHI



Phi Delta Chi (PDC) is a co-ed professional fraternity of pharmacy whose objective is to advance the science of pharmacy and its allied interests, and to foster and promote a fraternal spirit among its members. Its motto, “Alterum Alterius Auxilio Eget,” meaning “Each Needs the Help of the Other,” demonstrates PDC’s attitude towards the college, community, and its members. Founded in 1883, PDC is the first Greek letter organization established for members of pharmacy only. Among its 40,000 members were the late Eli Lilly and Hubert Humphrey. The University of Georgia PDC Chapter, Alpha Iota (AI), was founded in 1937 and has initiated over 1,000 Brothers. The late R.C. Wilson, Georgia’s Father of Pharmacy, was a charter member of Alpha Iota. Membership in PDC is by invitation only. Rush events are held each year during the fall semester and bids are issued to persons demonstrating the ideals of the fraternity. PDC has a rigorous pledge period after which eligibility for membership is determined. Professional, service, and social projects comprise many of the group’s activities. In service to the profession and the public, PDC participates in health fairs, hosts a 5k run/walk, volunteers at Talmadge, and sponsors events for St. Jude Children’s Research Hospital. Social activities include football tailgates, low-country boil, Spring Formal, and a retreat twice a year. Our Alpha Iota chapter is nationally ranked amongst the 100 chapters nationwide and has been participating in an achievement award program encouraging excellence and communication among chapters. Members attend Regional Conferences, Leader-Development Seminars, and Grand Council regularly to help further develop our Brothers being the leaders of pharmacy for tomorrow.

PHI LAMBDA SIGMA



Phi Lambda Sigma, the Pharmacy Leadership Society, is a national honor society whose mission is to recognize student pharmacist leaders and to promote the development of leadership within the pharmacy profession. In 1974, the Delta Chapter of Phi Lambda Sigma was organized at the University of Georgia. Membership consists of four categories: student, faculty, honorary, and alumni. To be eligible for membership, a student shall be in their second or third year of study, of high moral and ethical character, and shall meet scholastic and curriculum standards. Nomination for membership is made on

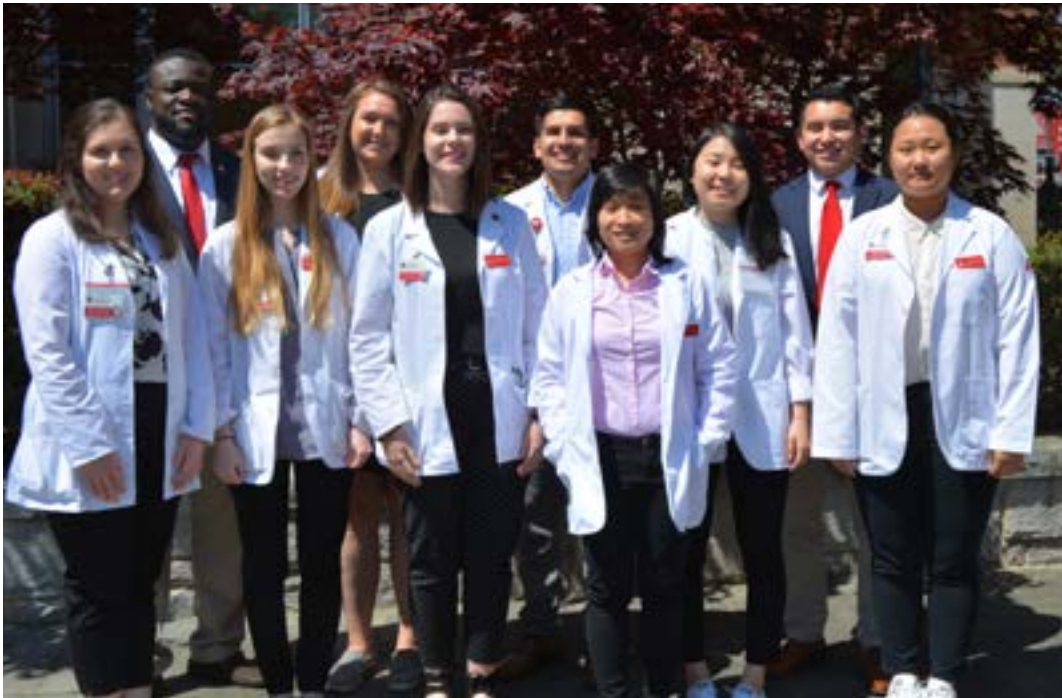
the basis of the nominee’s demonstration of dedication, service, and leadership in the advancement of pharmacy. The purpose of Phi Lambda Sigma is to recognize those individuals who have attained a high degree of leadership through their time and efforts focused on the betterment of the profession. The objective is to encourage these people to continue their worthy endeavor and to stimulate others to attain these high ideals. To be elected into this society is rightfully considered one of the high points of one’s career. As an organization, we hope to encourage leadership and service throughout the College of Pharmacy.

RHO CHI SOCIETY



The Rho Chi Society is the national pharmacy honor society that recognizes academic excellence of pharmacy students. The organizational mission is to encourage and recognize intellectual achievement, stimulate critical inquiry to advance pharmacy, contribute to the development of intellectual leaders, promote the highest ethical standards, and foster collaboration. In order to be invited to join the Rho Chi Society, Doctor of Pharmacy students must have completed at least three semesters in pharmacy and have a pharmacy grade point average in the top 20% of their class. The Alpha Kappa chapter of the Rho Chi Society was founded at the University of Georgia in 1948.

STUDENT COLLEGE OF CLINICAL PHARMACY



The Student College of Clinical Pharmacy is a recognized student chapter of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy. 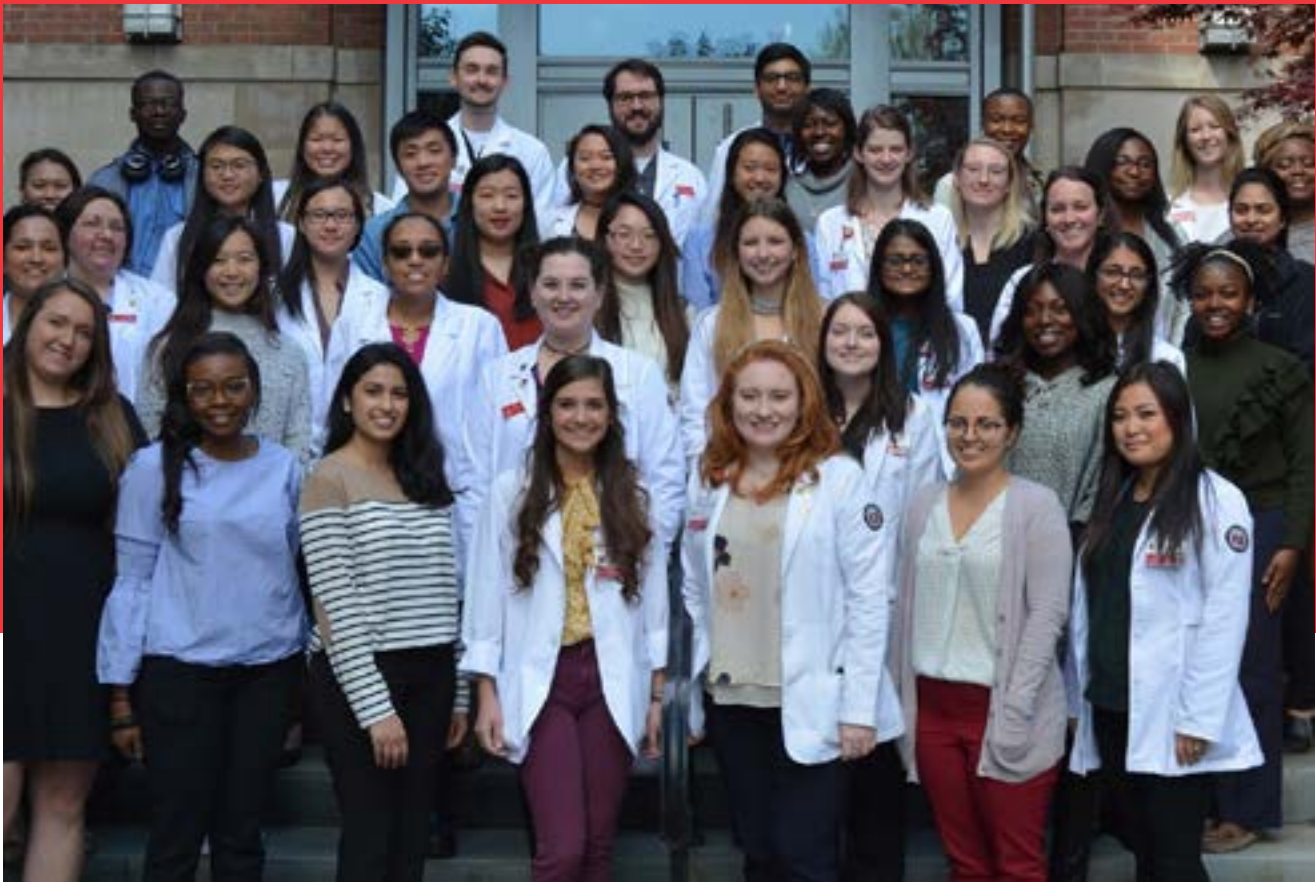
STUDENT DIABETES CLUB
