#### Years 1-3

Complete the prescribed pre-pharmacy coursework while taking advantage of the Augusta University experience, which provides an ideal foundation for a patientcentered healthcare career.

> Complete at least 35 hours of prerequisite courses in time to formally apply to the UGA Pharm.D. program by September 1 of your junior year.



Matriculate into UGA's PharmD program where you will train to become a medication expert, managing and preventing drug-related issues. Dual MBA, MS, and MPH degrees are available as well as Certificates in Regulatory Sciences and Pharmacy Entrepreneurship.

Admitted students must **satisfactorily** (earn at least a C- in all courses) complete all 69 hours of prerequisite coursework and other requirements.\*
